## Introduction

In 2013 the Myanmar Government committed itself to promoting responsible tourism in Tourism Master Plan as well as through numerous policies like the Responsible Tourism Policy (2012) and the Policy on Community Involvement in Tourism - CIT (2013).

The challenge is to implement those planning and policy documents. At present there is a scarcity of capacities, often a missing understanding on how to involve communities in tourism and the lack of guidance for the enactment on local and national levels. A broad multi-stakeholder approach is needed to discuss and address these challenges, in particular those to safeguard communities so they are able to gain an economic as well as social advantage from tourism development.

The increasing number of international visitors to Myanmar and growth of domestic travelers provide income opportunities for local communities especially in rural, and vulnerable areas. The prospect is to develop an increasing number of tourism services, such as local guesthouses and locally organized tourist activities through the involvement of local communities, additional to the already existing planned private and public sector developments. This should provide a higher degree of inclusion and involvement for the local communities.

This tourism development brings not only opportunities but bears also challenges. Other countries in South-East Asia have already experienced this. Therefore, it is important to promote the principles of sustainable and responsible tourism development in local communities. The workshop serves as a knowledge exchange platform for all stakeholders: government, development agencies, local business and civil society.

#### Key workshop objectives

- Share views on community projects in tourism with a particular focus on common challenges;
- Current status of B&B Services, (Village) Tour Conductor Training and promotion of SMEs in tourism;
- Identification if there is an interest in establishing a multi-stakeholder network on Tourism and Community Involvement in Myanmar;
