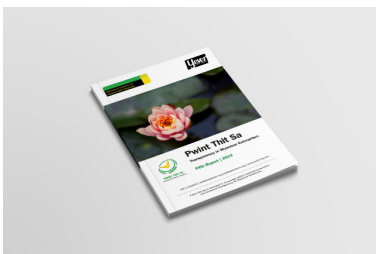




Inclusive workplaces make good sense for business
