## Pwint Thit Sa Update

The second and final assessment of more than 270 Myanmar companies for Pwint Thit Sa 2022 has commenced, with the final results expected to be consolidated by late September. As in the first round, companies will be assessed on any improvements they have made to the information disclosed on their website across a total of 151 criteria. The Pwint Thit Sa 2022 report will be released in Q4 2022.

## Identifying Work Opportunities for Persons with Disability

## Spatial Map of Myanmar Extractives Licences

MCRB, together with Yever, is currently finalising the TRIM-Map (Towards Responsible Investment In Myanmar) [www.trim-map.org](http://www.trim-map.org) pilot project which will map investment data in Tanintharyi Region. To complement this, we are making available [www.meiti-map.org](http://www.meiti-map.org), a geospatial mapping for extractives and pearl licence data from the 6th (and most recent) Myanmar Extractives Industries Transparency initiative (MEITI) report, which covers licence data from 2018.
