


## FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION

#### **Article 19**



- Right to opinion **vs**. Right to non-discrimination




## **RIGHT TO PRIVACY**


#### **Article 12**

No one shall be subjected to arbitrary interference with his privacy, family, home or correspondence, nor to attacks upon his honour and reputation. Everyone has the right to the protection of the law against such interference or attacks.





## **EQUALITY OF ACCESS**

#### Article 2

Everyone is entitled to all the rights and freedoms set forth in this Declaration, without distinction of any kind, such as race, colour, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status. Furthermore, no distinction shall be made on the basis of the political, jurisdictional or international status of the country or territory to which a person belongs, whether it be independent, trust, non-self-governing or under any other limitation of sovereignty.





## **Freedom of Expression**

- Adopting a right to information law that promotes digital information and protects digital rights
- Repealing Article 66(d) of the Telecommunications Law
- Improving people's digital literacy using both formal and informal methods, especially of MPs and judges.



- Adopting a data protection law that protects users' privacy and data online
- Establishing a lawful interception framework
- Improving people's awareness of the right to privacy.



- Promoting e-gov, ensuring websites are accessible to all, in compliance with WCAG 2.0 (Web Content Accessibility Guidelines).
- Supporting the Unicode Migration Plan
- Supporting the implementation of initiatives to promote accessibility for persons with disabilities, women and ethnic communities.


## Workshops on focused digital rights issues
