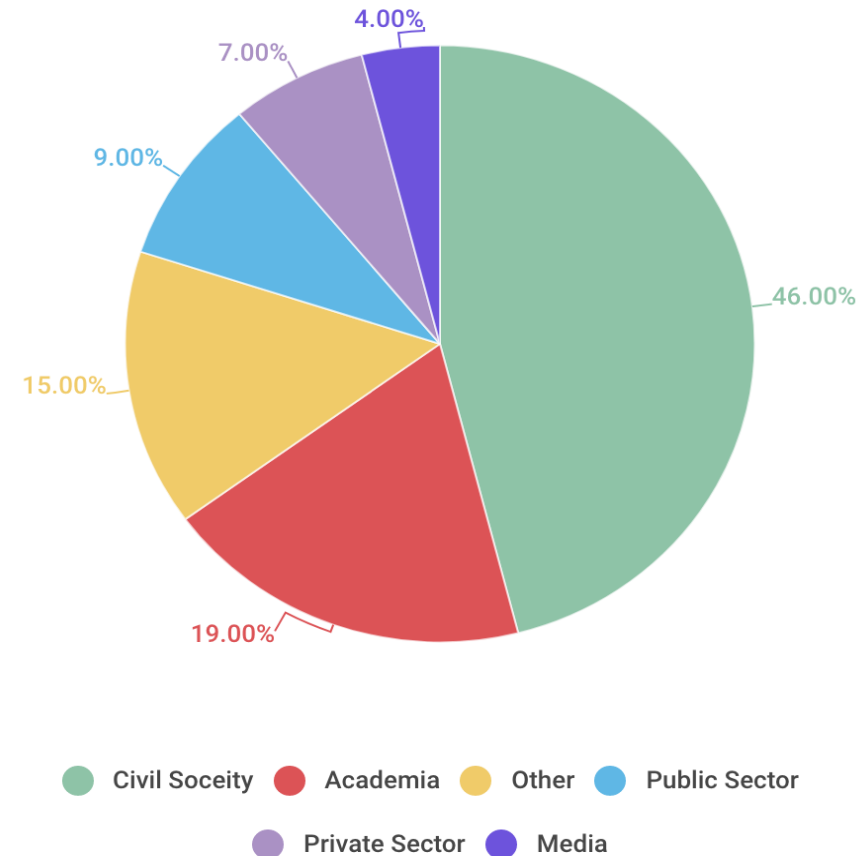
Our work on digital rights

- Promote understanding of international standards on responsible business conduct, and “translating” them to the context.
- Reactive respond to government consultations and proactive policy briefs (on www.mcrb.org.mm):
 - Analysis on Myanmar ICT legal framework
 - Data Protection
 - Cyber Crime and Cyber Security.
- Work with ICT businesses on their responsibility to respect human rights
- Advising international ICT companies on key challenges and risks in operating in Myanmar
- Advising local ICT companies on international human rights standards
- Working with users/consumers on privacy protection in the cyber space
 - Recommendations on safe online shopping and financial activities
 - Mechanism of consumer protection and impacts of the internet shutdowns in Myanmar

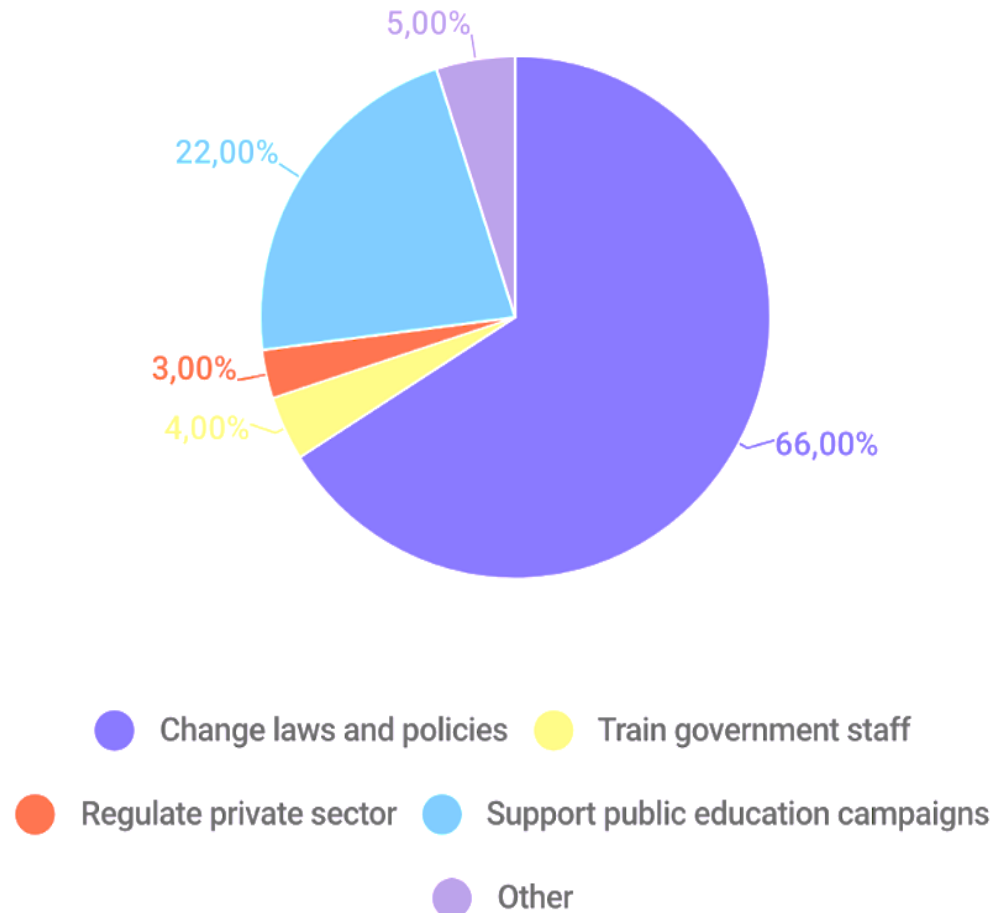

Equality of online access – 2019 MDRF poll

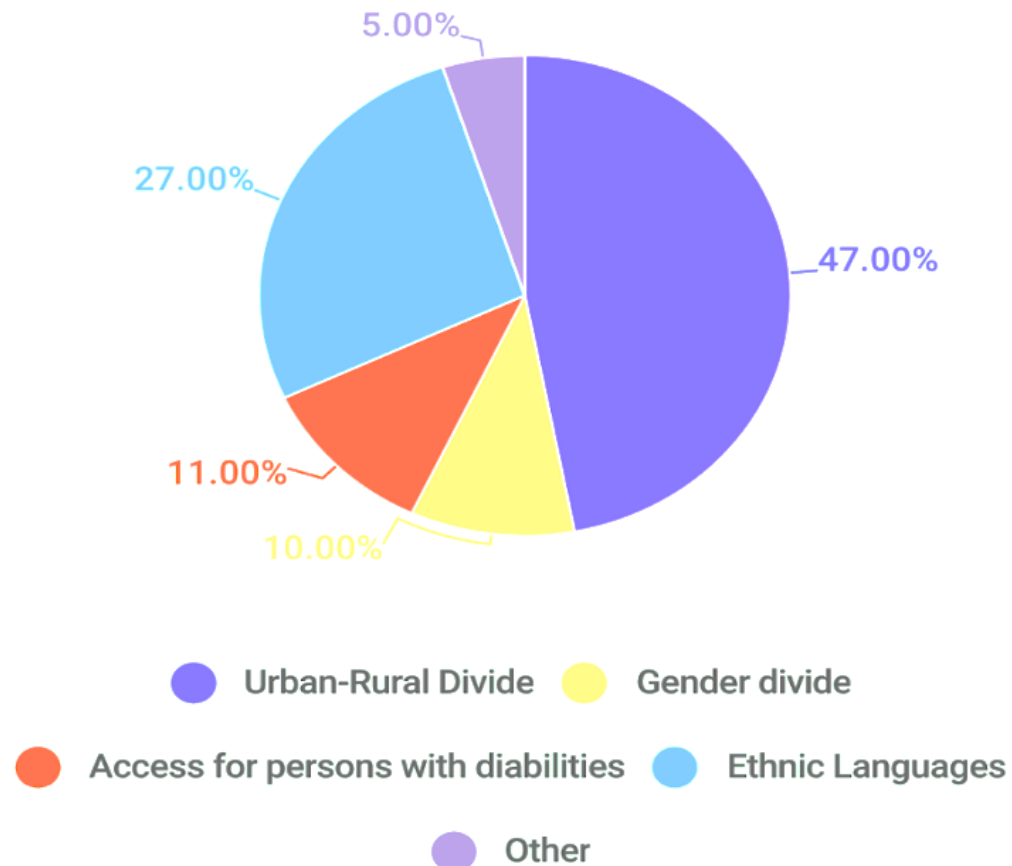
Improved 78

Freedom of online expression – 2019 MDRF poll

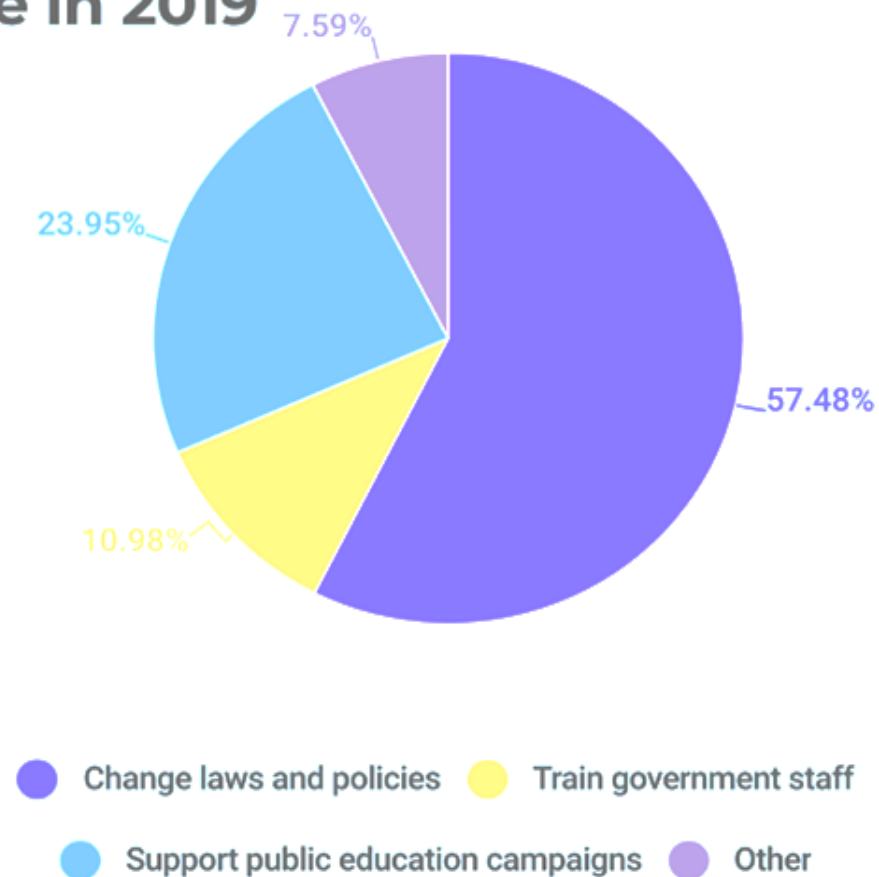
Improved 25%

Developments since the last MDRF - Privacy

- Huawei facial recognition cameras deployed and then taken down in Mandalay
- SIM Card registration
 - January 2020 – over 27 million SIMs registered >2 SIMs per NRC
 - April 2019 – introduced limit of 2 SIMs per NRC
 - Tender for database including biometrics
- Launch of Myanmar Information Security Association
- Still waiting for draft legislation on cybersecurity, e-commerce, data protection (or e-government)
 - World Bank sponsored draft(s) with MoTC
- Government wants to amend March 2017 'Law Protecting the Privacy and Security of Citizens'



Equality of Online Access – Internet Shutdown

- Internet shutdown in nine townships in Rakhine and Chin since 20 June
 - #StopInternetShutdownMM Campaign
 - CSO, UN, business statements
 - Blackout Day 101 30 September

Equality of Online Access – Universal Service

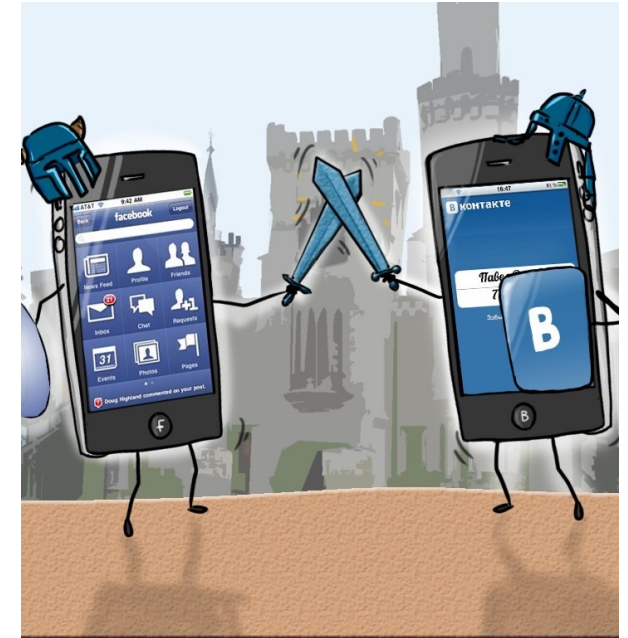
- [Universal Service Strategy 2019-2023](#) adopted Dec 2019 and issued Jan 2020 (consultation Jan 2018). Covers 23 townships; 95% mobile coverage by 2022.
- Universal Service Fund (USF) 2% levy on revenue. Intended for:
 - Developing infrastructure
 - Digital literacy training programs
 - Access for the people at commercially nonviable areas
 - Implementing projects for minorities, persons with disabilities and poor people
- Aug 2018 [Regulations](#) and USF [Operation Manual](#) (April 2019)
- Board of the USF Trustees (first meeting [25 March 2019](#)):
 - Chairman - U Thar Oo (Deputy Minister of MoTC); Members - U Myo Swe (DG of PTD of MoTC), U Swe Tint Kyu (Director of Consumer Affairs Department), Daw Khin Mar Thi (Deputy Director of Budget Department), Daw Caroline Yin Yin Htay (Representatives of the Operators)
- Out of the 23 townships, tenders called ([Nov 2018](#), closed Feb 2019) for four townships: Sidoktaya, An, Minbya and Hpasawng to be implemented with World Bank loan. An and Minbya (both Rakhine) won by MPT and Telenor.
- MoTC held a meeting with the Operators in May 2019 for the USF projects for 21 townships to be implemented with USF

- UNICODE Transition


Developments since the last MDRF – Freedom of Expression

 - Facebook
- Draft Hatred Law (formerly Hate Speech)
 - Committee under MoHA drafted a bill, UAGO, Cabinet
- Usage of 66d
